#### **Amelie White (Ratty/PC Flatfoot)**

She has enjoyed playing such different parts as Elvira in Blithe Spirit and Mrs Swabb in Habeas Corpus, Morgan le Fay in Camelot, the Genie of the Lamp in Aladdin and leading roles in The Pajama Game and High Society. This is the first time that she has been called upon to act as a puppeteer.



### Russell Bailey (Badger/Prosecution Counsel/Warder)

This is Russell's third production with DADS, having previously starred in Caught in Court and Joking Apart. He has previously acted in everything from Sondheim musicals to Shakespearean tragedies to pantomimes. He is looking forward to the challenge of playing three different characters in the same production.





#### **Mark Wilkin**

Mark has been a member of DADS since 2006 when he first appeared on the Village Hall stage as Francis Fryer in Calamity Jane. Other DADS shows include: According To Rumour; Kiss Me Kate; Show Boat; Agatha Crusty and the Village Hall Murders; Fiddler on the Roof; Habeas Corpus, Treasure Island and; Suddenly At Home.

Mark has performed with a number of other local groups including Sinodun Players; HAODS; Henley Players and Breakaleg. Acting credits include: Gypsy; Brassed Off; Mary Poppins; Chitty Chitty Bang Bang; Showtime; Anything Goes; Jekyll & Hyde the musical; The Life of Riley; Hobson's Choice; See How They Run; Return to the Forbidden Planet; The Hired Man; Witness For The Prosecution; Are You Being Served? and; Guys and Dolls.

Mark's directing credits include: Ernie's Incredible Illucinations; The Mistress of the Inn; A Flea In Her Ear; The Dover Road and Sex Please We're Sixty!





## **Philip Dart - Playwright**

After gaining a degree in Drama at Hull University, Philip's early directing career took him to the Nuffield Theatre, Southampton, the Plymouth Theatre Company and the Soho Poly Theatre in London. From 1987 to 2012 he was the Artistic Director of the Channel Theatre Company and subsequently Chalkfoot Theatre Arts. He now works as a freelance Theatre Director in the UK and Europe.

As well as working as a theatre director Philip is also a playwright who specialises in literary adaptations. His adaptations include Jane Eyre; The School for Wives; George Lillo's The London Merchant; E Nesbit's classic children's novel The Phoenix and the Carpet; Jane Austen's Emma; Anthony Hope's The Prisoner of Zenda and Robert Tressell's The Ragged Trousered Philanthropists. His adaptation of Wilkie Collins' The Haunted Hotel has twice toured to large scale venues in the UK.

Philip's adaptation of Erskine Childers'; The Riddle of the Sands was nominated in four categories by the prestigious Off West End awards and his production of Tom McGrath's Laurel and Hardy embarked on a successful national tour having first been used to launch a brand new regional arts venue.

In 2012 Philip wrote and directed a new play, Running For Glory, about the 1922 Paris Olympics which received great critical success when it toured southern England.

For over 25 years Philip wrote and directed the pantomime at the Buxton Opera. Philip is also a regular guest director at Vienna's English Theatre, where productions have included Arms and the Man, Blithe Spirit, Charlie's Aunt, Arsenic and Old Lace, The Importance of Being Earnest, Rough Crossing, Lend Me a Tenor and a box office breaking production of Agatha Christie's Witness for the Prosecution.
